Remember a Haiku poem has three lines; the first line has 5 syllables, the second has 7 syllables and the third line has 5 syllables. On Seesaw you will find different themes your Haiku could be on, as well as two example Haiku poems.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Topic</p> <p>Shang Dynasty Inventions.</p> <p>The Shang Dynasty are famous for a number of reasons, mainly due to their different inventions. Can you research the different Shang Dynasty inventions and display your findings in the form of a spider diagram with drawings of each invention? An example piece will be on Seesaw to help you.</p>
